I found the fifth and sixth sessions particularly engaging, partly because Ron VandenBrink of Diaconal Ministries Canada described DMC's vision of exploring strengths already in our neighbourhood and allowing the church and neighbours to learn new skills together. The sixth session explores the concept of asset-based community development, or ABCD, and build on the strengths of a community rather than its deficits.
