A. General Updates:

We are grateful that the Global Affairs Canada-CFGB Grant Agreement has been signed (4:1 funds). The new grant agreement is for three years and included a narrower focus on humanitarian contexts. It also includes a considerable increase in expectations around the Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse.

C. Community Development:

In March, 2019, Cyclone Idai devastated communities in the southern part of Malawi. Houses collapsed, people lost their lives, fields and household items washed away. World Renew’s partnership with *Help a Child* helped the most vulnerable households to not only rebuild their lives and be better prepared for

future natural disasters, but also encouraged communities to collaborate to address their long-term challenges.

Most community members are subsistence farmers and due to poor soil, erosion, and changing weather patterns, people harvest less and less. We trained the community on basic watershed management and sustainable agriculture. They experimented growing more indigenous edible plants that were more suitable for the hotter climate and by planting more diverse crops, families now have access to fresh vegetables year round.

Loveness Chibisa of Saindi village is one of those farmers. She and her husband plant vegetable seeds provided by the project. Loveness says, "Through this project, I have learned a lot of things. I used to have a garden but never harvested all year round. Now, I sell a minimum of K4,000 (\$5 USD) of vegetables per day and manage to pay school fees for my 3 children." The Chibisa family also bought a treadle pump to irrigate their garden. This year, they managed to harvest thirty 50kg bags of maize. They plan to sell the maize during lean season to have money during the hunger season.

D. International Disaster Response (IDR)

On Saturday, August 14 at 8:29 AM local time, a 7.2 magnitude earthquake hit southern Haiti. The epicenter was located in the Nippes department, 150 km southwest of Port-au-Prince. This earthquake comes on the heels of many months of civil unrest, violence at the hands of gangs, and President Moïse's assassination. This is yet another major setback for the impoverished and long-suffering country.

This is a story of World Renew's continuing response; as soon as it's written, it's out of date. I want to highlight that world Renew swung into action with one hour of the earthquake; right away, it was two-pronged:

1. Disaster response work on the ground, working in collaboration with other agencies,
2. Information distribution for learning and fundraising. Within a day and a half, 14 pieces of communication went out to donors and churches.

World Renew, with its partners, immediately began to meet urgent needs. This included providing tarps for shelter and non-food item (NFI) kits that included household and personal care items for families who have lost their homes. At the same time, we were taking part in assessment efforts to determine medium-term needs. The response is now moving into that phase.

E. Refugee Settlement Activities:

Between January 1, 2021 and July 28 2021, 23 refugee sponsorship applications were submitted to IRCC for a total of 38 refugees.

Between January 1, 2021 and July 28 2021, 25 refugees arrived to Canada through World Renew sponsorships with the top three countries of origin being Syria, Eritrea, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. 96 churches are currently engaged in refugee sponsorship and resettlement (refers to churches waiting for an arrival, currently settling a family or submitting a sponsorship application for 2021) of which 68 are CRCs and 28 are BCRCs.
