Report From Vitalpoint Church

This past season of ministry was one of growth in numbers and depth of faith. Our overall theme this year has been "abundantly more." Ephesians 3:20 has been at the forefront of all we have seen God do.

Our two sites that run weekend gatherings are Poplar Hill and Exeter and experiencing incredible growth. These are both very strongly attended with many non-church people being invited by our VPC community. One guy Andrew was invited by one of our band members to our Exeter site, it was so amazing to see how God was working in him. After a month of attending, he was baptized at our outdoor service in Poplar Hill.

The baptism service was a true move of God. We had 17 adults signed up to go into the waters of baptism and on that day we had 5 spontaneous baptisms bringing the total to 22. Andrew mentioned

above was one of them. We also had 7 families bring their children to the front to publicly proclaim they would raise their children within the Christian Family. All Glory to God for "abundantly more."

Clinton will be hosting it's first weekend gathering Sept 25th. Because of our involvement in the community, we're seeing a huge interest, plus we are seeing believers getting fired up about their walk with Jesus and a growing desire to reach their friends. I guess having a VPC car in the Clinton Demolition Derby helps raise awareness.

In the VPC Family(Kids & Students) ministry area we've seen a powerful move of God. The teams are growing (90 team members VPC wide) and there have been more students than we have ever seen before. Some of the students are now bringing their parents to weekend gatherings. In the kids' area we have shifted to a discipleship model and we are teaching children about spiritual gifts and how they are part of the church now, not the future.

At Vitalpoint, we're seeing a faith filled resilient community ready to fulfill the mission Jesus gave His Church. No doubt there's struggles, but we have seen so many believers refreshed and ready to learn, grow and reach more and more people for Jesus. We are hearing stories of people who have left the church years ago coming back for the first time and are now plugging in.
