This past year, we also introduced a new Bachelor of Kinesiology degree to go along with the granting of the recent Bachelor of Business Administration, now in its third year. Academic planning continues to consider strategic roll outs of new programs, including possible new masters degrees, that will serve the growing needs of today's students, all while maintaining a commitment to Redeemer's Reformed Christian academic mission.

Redeemer's new Innovation Centre will launch this fall with the purpose of serving God by inspiring and infusing a spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship across the curriculum. The Innovation Centre will include a makerspace and will be located on the lower level of the Charis Live and Learn Centre. The Centre is a space for applied creativity and learning within the university, providing active, real-world opportunities that will inspire and instill a spirit of innovation and entrepreneurship in those who participate.
