Building into our Diaconal Coach Network

Our Diaconal Coaches receive ongoing training and equipping!

This past January, our coaches and staff spent 2 1/2 days at Mt. Mary's Retreat Centre in Ancaster, ON. The agenda was full but we also ensured that there was time for discussion, given that we are in a very dynamic time with the CRC. This year's training theme was on having a more asset-based approach in our ministries, not solely focusing on needs and gaps.

Each year we enjoy a site visit, typically a past or present NewGround Partner. This year we headed to Good News Fellowship CRC in London, ON. Their *More Food, Less Hunger program* is addressing food insecurity. This church is highly engaged in their local community! We also heard from Community Counselling London, a former NewGround partner, that rents space from the church.

The weekend also included times of prayer and worship, as well as a catered dinner combined with a meaningful celebration of the Lord's Supper.

Did we get your attention?

Have your deacons helped someone going through a financial difficulty? Have you helped them more than once? What did you know about their situation before you helped? Did you wonder if they took advantage of you? Did you wonder if you could've done something more... or something different?

IF YOU'VE WRESTLED WITH 'HOW' TO DO BENEVOLENCE IN YOUR CHURCH, YOU ARE NOT ALONE! Often when deacons help individuals or families more than once, they don't have a clear understanding of the entire situation and, therefore, how to appropriately respond. Deacons will often 'react' by addressing the immediate need (eg. paying a bill, giving a grocery gift card) and hope for the best.

In some cases this could be the correct response; sometimes someone just needs help that one time. But in other situations, this same response might only superficially address the real underlying root causes. Even worse, it could contribute to greater dependency, with the church playing an enabling role rather than an empowering one.

Our "Helping Without Harming in Church Benevolence" Workshop has become one of our most popular trainings. Since September, ~132 deacons and ministry leaders have taken this workshop! In it, we show deacons how they can move away from offering short-term help (aka 'relief') and be better prepared to walk alongside individuals or households, bringing positive and long lasting changes to their lives (aka 'rehabilitation' and 'development').

It continues to be our our honour and privilege to support and equip deacons and churches like yours. May God bless you in your ongoing ministry!
