


Fall 2024 Classis Report | HURON

A Message from Jamie McIntosh - Executive Director, World Renew Canada

Christian Reformed Churches in Canada Resolutely Back World Renew Canada's Work

During the reign of King Saul, his son Jonathan, ventured forth with his armourbearer to advance on a Philistine outpost. "On each side of the pass that Jonathan intended to cross...was a cliff." Though daunting to navigate, Jonathan was sparked with zeal to defeat the enemies who were wanting to make God's children their slaves. The King's son hatched a daring plan against the odds, reasoning that "Perhaps the Lord will act in our behalf. Nothing can hinder the Lord from saving, whether by many or by few." (1 Sam 14:6)

Travelling by his side, ever loyal and courageous, Jonathan's armour-bearer stood undaunted, backing Jonathan to the hilt: "Do all that you have in mind...Go ahead; I am with you heart and soul." (1 Sam 14:7) So together they fearlessly plunged into a veritable hornet's nest of Philistine soldiers.

When one looks at the plight of the dispossessed and oppressed around our planet today, witnessing people reeling from natural disasters and the ravages of war, it would be easy to look at the overwhelming odds, tuck tail and run. But for more than six decades, CRCs in Canada and the United States have felt compelled by Christ's example to stand alongside the imperilled, commissioning then-CRWRC, now World Renew, to come alongside local communities and churches, strengthening them with a fighting chance.

To this day, World Renew Canada is only able to rise to the challenge and face down the giants of poverty, hunger and exploitation with our partners and participants around the world, because CRCs across Canada have vowed to surround us with prayers, special offerings, and voluntary service engagements.

That fateful day in the early days of the Kings, Jonathan and his valiant armourbearer -- whose name is only known in the heavenly realms -- routed the enemy outpost in a stunning victory.

Thousands of years later, we are seeing the CRC and its members across Canada stand with us in rising ways to advance the struggle against poverty and injustice:

- Canadian church giving for fiscal 23/24 totalled a whopping \$3,515,610.
- 13 Canadian Churches are in "Advanced Partnerships", deeply engaged with WR's work through steadfast support of a specific project prayerfully, financially and relationally.
- Fiscal year 23/24 saw 118 Canadians visit World Renew's work in person across 13 trips.
- 13 International Response Managers continued voluntary training, worked on projects remotely, and travelled to disaster sites to assist with emergency aid.
- Refugee resettlements continued across Canada, and our work attained a "Zero Risk" rating with the Federal Government, a testament to the continued fidelity of our work since 1979.
- 21 World Renew Justice-learning events engaged 261 people from 30 Canadian churches and organizations.
- Since the Abbotsford flood of November 2021, World Renew provided two annual grants of \$200,000 each, providing the salary of the Abbotsford Disaster Response Committee project coordinator, and enabling the ADRC to provide building materials such as lumber, lawn care, and furniture/appliances for the community.

Looking forward, we anticipate an historic year of Canadian Foodgrains Bank projects, with World Renew's current 23 percent equity share allowing us to robustly program directly and with trusted partners, all through the generosity of Canadians and the up to 4:1 match from the Canadian government.

This year, we hope to resettle scores more families fleeing desperate situations, with Canadian churches and families serving as conscientious hosts as part of our Refugee Sponsorship and Resettlement program. We are exploring how best to deepen Canada's response to disasters closer to home, in ways that are complementary to Canada's unique federal response mechanisms.

Thank you for your faithfulness enabling us show up in places where people are so deserving, yet like brave Jonathan of long ago, find themselves surrounded by towering cliffs and glowering enemies. How reassuring it is to know that you stand alongside these families—and us—as fellow armour-bearers in the fight for a brighter, hope-filled future. World Renew can confidently stand with them, knowing our Canadian churches have "got our back!"

Thank you for such faithful and fervent support. Heaven knows its worth on earth.
